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***Newborn Midwifery Care For Baby Mrs. E With Caput Succedaneum At
Caringin Health Center***

ABSTRACT

Birth trauma is trauma to the baby that is received because of the birth process. During the delivery process, almost every part of the baby's body can experience trauma or injury, most birth trauma is mild and can improve immediately. Caput succedaneum is a subcutis oedema caused by the suppression of the birth canal in the delivery of the head position, in the form of a lump, without firm boundaries and crossing the sutura boundary. Risk factors for the occurrence of caput succedaneum due to the long labor process, vaginal delivery with vaccum extraction, and in primigravida pregnancy. The purpose of writing this Final Project Report is to be able to make a scientific paper from the results of the implementation of Newborn Midwifery Care in Infants. Mrs. E with caput succedaneum.

The method used is case reporting and documentation in the form of SOAP (Subjective, Objective, Analysis, Management). Data collection techniques through interviews, physical examinations, observations, documentation studies, and literature studies.

Subjective data was obtained by Mrs. E, HPHT 23-06-2023, estimated delivery 30-03-2024, amniotic fluid ruptured since 12.00 WIB. The delivery time is 1 hour and 10 minutes and the mother has strained before the complete opening. Objective data were obtained with normal vital signs, body weight of 2800 grams, on the head there was a soft palpable lump, the boundary was not firm. The analysis obtained by the neonatal baby Mrs. E is full-term according to the gestational period with caput succedaneum. Management is provided by taking care of normal newborns, monitoring and providing education on trauma so that there is no need to worry because the lump will disappear within 2-3 days without treatment. After taking care of Mrs. E's baby for 20 days, it can be concluded that the baby is in good condition, there are no abnormalities, no complications and the caput succedaneum disappears on the 2nd day. It is hoped that the Caringin Health Center can improve the quality of services in fulfilling midwifery care with service standards to improve quality and provide services, especially to newborns with caput succedaneum.
