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COMPREHENSIVE MIDWIFERY CARE OF MRS.H WITH ANEMIA AND PREMATURE RUPTURE OF MEMBRANES (PROM) AT MIDWIFERY E VILLAGE SUBDISTRICT CIANJUR

ABSTRACT

Complications that often occur during pregnancy, childbirth include anemia and Premature rupture of membranes (PROM). Anemia in pregnant women often occurs due to hemodilution, coupled with a lack of nutritional intake, the effect of cells in the body lacking oxygen and can occur PROM and infection. Comprehensive midwifery care can immediately deal with complications that occur so that complications in the next phase can be prevented. The Objective is to implement comprehensive midwifery care for antenatal care, intranatal care, postpartum and neonatal to Mrs. H G2P0A1 in the Independent Practice of Midwife E Cianjur.

The method used is a case study in the district. Cianjur, from January to March 2020. The subject of this care is Ny.H, 23 years old with 32-33 weeks' pregnancy. Data collection techniques obtained from primary and secondary data.

During the third trimester of pregnancy the mother had anemia with Hb 8.6 gr / dl, the mother was given 2x60 mg / day Fe tablets and nutritional counseling. During the first stage of labor, the mother experienced PROM and was referred to the hospital. Babies are born spontaneously. Stage III, IV runs normally without complications. The puerperium is running normally, the puerperium on day 4, HB level of 11.2 gr / dl, puerperium on the 42nd day, the mother has not used contraception. Babies had been given a formula, their weight had increased by 1300 grams for 6 weeks had received HBO, BCG and Polio 1 immunization.

Midwifery care with midwifery management has been provided and the problem has been resolved. Midwives are expected to be able to detect early anemia and management of anemia, detection and management of PROM according to authority, breast milk selection starting from the time of the ANC by involving the family
